

Image Release and Consent Agreement



This image release and consent form is essential for all program members. Youth should have control over and knowledge of how their personal images will be used. Juvenile Law Center respects the consent of their program members. No image of a program member will be used without this consent form. Please note that a separate form should be created for the guardians of members under the age of 18.

Name

I hereby grant to Juvenile Law Center the right and permission to copyright a photograph/video of me, or a quotation from me in its own name or otherwise to use, re-use, publish, and re-publish, and otherwise reproduce, modify, and display the photograph, in whole or in part, individually or in conjunction with other photographs, and to use my name in connection there with if it so chooses. Use of the photograph/video includes digital imaging and use on the website, which is accessible globally. I hereby release and discharge Juvenile Law Center from all claims and demands arising out of or in connection with the use of the photographs, including without limitation, all claims for libel and/or invasion of privacy.

Juvenile Law Center may sell, assign, license or otherwise transfer all rights granted to it hereunder. This authorization and release shall also inure to the benefit of the legal representatives, licensees, and assignees of Juvenile Law Center. I am of full age (eighteen and older) and have the right to contract in my own name. I have read the foregoing and fully understand the contents of this Release. This Release shall be binding upon me and my heirs, legal representatives, and assignees.

Examples of Appropriate and Acceptable Photo Usage

- Projects that youth advocates have worked on
- Celebrations coming up related to Juvenile Law Center's work as a whole
- General Juvenile Law Center brand and marketing materials, including the website
- Social media celebrating the Youth Advocates' work or related accomplishments
- Recognition of specific events, such as Foster Care Awareness Month IF youth have helped to write a related blog for the month or offered to share a story, etc.
- Retroactively, if the use of the photos is connected to project-specific work the youth were involved in fundraising specifically for Youth Advocacy programs

Photos cannot and should not be used for the following

- Any publication that is not directly related to the Youth Advocates' work or the Youth Advocacy Programs in general. Such publications may include, but are not limited to:

Blogs and emails from staff about issues that Youth Advocates did not assist or work on	Issue reports
Fundraising letters and emails	Social media posts
Articles and blogs for other outlets	Presentations (PowerPoint, Prezi, etc.)
